

The Bible: A Lot to Say About Nothing

In regards to speaking about nothing, notice what the Bible has to say about our sins that have been forgiven by God:

“They will not teach again, each man his neighbor and each man his brother, saying, ‘Know the Lord,’ for they will all know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them,” declares the Lord, “for I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more” (Jeremiah 31:34).

Nothing that God has forgiven of our sins will be remembered as a means of accusation against us. Here is another important nothing from the Bible:

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:38–39).

Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ. I would say that is an important nothing! Here is another important nothing found in the Bible:

“For nothing will be impossible with God” (Luke 1:37)

And looking at them Jesus said to them, “With people this is impossible, but with God all things are possible” (Matthew 19:26).

Nothing is impossible with God. This nothing is important in terms of having confidence in our prayers and the promises of God. Knowing this nothing keeps us going when nothing else will.

There is one last nothing I want you to consider. Here it is from Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians.

If I have the gift of prophecy, and know all mysteries and all knowledge; and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing (1 Corinthians 13:2).

Without love, we are all **nothing**. As you can hopefully see, the Bible does indeed have a lot to say about nothing. The nothings it describes are really something! This is the one time I hope you get nothing from this article.
